

TE NGUTU GOLF CLUB SAFE USE OF CARTS POLICY

The Golf Cart Policy is for the safety of each golf cart driver and other golfers on the property of Te Ngutu Golf Club. It is to reduce the possible risks associated with the use of golf carts and outlines your responsibilities while operating a golf cart at Te Ngutu Golf Club.

- All motorised golf cart drivers must possess a current driver's licence or be over the age of 18.
- The vehicle must be operated from the driver's side only.
- All golfers and motorised carts shall give way to course staff and machinery.
- To prevent possible serious injury, driver and passenger must keep their entire bodies within the vehicle. This includes hanging off the back of the cart.
- To prevent falls from the vehicle, remain seated when the vehicle is moving and hold onto handles or handrails at all times.
- Do not overload the vehicle and never have more passengers than seats available. Overloading the vehicle is considered as no more than those that can be comfortably seated.
- Golf carts must NOT block any entrance to buildings, stairways, ramps, or thoroughfares.
- To avoid the possibility of losing control of the vehicle, reduce speed for adverse driving conditions such as wet grass or rough or steep terrain and in crowded areas/roads and for turning.
- Do not drive under the influence of alcohol, drugs or medications that adversely affect your ability to drive or react.
- Do not tow, push or pull any other golf carts or any other vehicles unless when assisting with a broken down / stranded golf cart.

Rules on the course

- Keep carts at least 2 metres from all greens and greenside bunkers.
- Park carts at the rear of greens or to the side leading to the next tee. NEVER in front of greens. This will greatly assist the Pace of Play.
- Do not drive over mounds that are within 2m of greens.
- Do not drive on tee blocks or tee surrounds.
- If course conditions are wet, carts should only travel on the driest and firmest parts of the golf course and should stay away from critical golf areas as much as possible.
- In the event of a golf cart accident, please call the golf club on 06 272 8039 to file an accident report.
- Reckless or gross negligent driving automatically loses the privilege to drive any golf cart

Guests who breach this policy will have the carts revoked and pay a minimum penalty of \$200 or the value of what part(s) it costs to replace.

I have read the Te Ngutu Golf Club Golf Cart Responsibility Policy and will adhere to all of the stated requirements.
